City Commission Regular Meeting Tuesday, June 25, 2024

Video and Agenda Packet

Mayor Fred Cleveland called the meeting to order. Also in attendance were Vice Mayor Valli Perrine, Commissioners Randy Hartman, Lisa Martin, and Jason McGuirk. Staff present were City Manager Khalid Resheidat, Assistant City Manager Ron Neibert, Deputy City Clerk Sharon Harding, and City Attorney Carrie Avallone.

PROCLAMATIONS AND PRESENTATION

Parking Study Update by the Parking Consultant: Kerry Karl from LTG Have reviewed past documents; held discussions with stakeholders; analyzed data about traffic flows, tourist development tax, beach toll receipts, and GPS and cell phone data; taken visual counts of parking; made site visits—focusing on Flagler, Canal, & Venetian Bay town center. Concurs with recommendations of 2023 Parking Task Force that the city needs a full-time staff person dedicated to parking and mobility. Has looked at population growth estimates for Volusia County and Orlando, and at Volusia County's new beach access process and technology (in development). Final report in September 2024. Public input meeting to be held August 1, 2024, at the Brannon Center.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- Discussion with Volusia/Flagler American Heart Association regarding CPR training events and city employees participating the annual heart walk event.
- The city received an email from Senator Wright regarding projects that were submitted to the appropriations committee: only one project was approved by the committee, which was the N. Atlantic Drainage Project.
- Staff submitted a grant application for Corbin Park Stormwater project to County's Transform 386 Disaster Recovery Grant Program (requesting \$6M of needed \$8.4 M).
- Attended 4th Annual SEV Regional Economic Summit on 6/19/2024 and Juneteenth Gala both held at Brannon Center.
- Update on sale of 120 Flagler: advertising has been initiated.
- Efren Chavez, interim CEO of NSB Utility Commission, provided explanation on NSB utility outage that occurred in South Beach area on June 13-14, 2024, and provided strategies to prevent a similar recurrence.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Will Roberts, Volusia County Tax Collector, spoke about the Kids Tag Art program and partnerships. Nine (9) additional residents spoke: five in opposition to the proposed zoning changes listed under agenda items 10.B and 10.C; one on the need to uphold and revise as needed the city's Comprehensive Plan rather than responding to constant zoning change requests piecemeal; one with concerns about the proposed Deering Park development; one with concerns about the city's lack of maintenance and dredging of Turnbull Canal; one with concerns about several of the city's contracts listed in the Consent Agenda; and as a show of force, some 20 members of the audience stood to indicate opposition to the changes proposed in agenda items 10.B and 10.C.

 property at 2331 State Rd 44. Motion to approve passed 3-2 (Martin and
 Cleveland voting no).
- 9.B Re-consider the approval of Variance Application No. V-11-22 for the property located at 3311 Hill Street. **Motion to approve passed unanimously**.
- 9.C Conduct a Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing to review and consider the approval of Reserve at Lake Waterford Final Plat and to Authorize the Mayor to Execute the Contract for Plat Recording. Motion to approve passed unanimously.

- 10.A Ordinance No. 45-24: Conduct the First Reading of an ordinance, which if adopted upon the Second Reading and Public Hearing, would rezone a property by adding the Historic Building Overlay District, (HBOD) to a property located at 403 Magnolia Street known as the Woman's Club.
- 10.B Ordinance No. 46-24: Conduct the First Reading and Public Hearing of an Ordinance, which if adopted upon the Second Reading and Public Hearing, would amend the Land Development Regulations by adding a definition of Floor Area Ratio, Commercial.
- 10.C Ordinance No. 47-24: Conduct the First Reading and Public Hearing of an Ordinance, which if adopted upon the Second Reading and Public Hearing, would rezone 1.01 acres of land from B-2 Neighborhood Business District to Planned Unit Development, at 1300 S. Atlantic Avenue.
